Join us in the Justice Studies PhD program at the nation's first School of Social Transformation. We take a unique approach to the study of justice by examining the intersecting forms of injustice, engaging multiple visions of justice and working with an array of communities and contexts.

Our program prepares future scholars and change agents to address complex social problems by employing different disciplinary perspectives and methodological approaches, using social science skills informed by insights from the humanities. You will gain the training needed to analyze social, economic, cultural, political, and legal inequalities and promote pathways to more just societies.
